INSPIRING ACADEMIC COURSES

The Easter 2024 Oxford Certificate Programmes at Worcester College offer a choice of one of the following cutting-edge courses, taught by tutors from Oxford and Cambridge:

1 Economics and Business Management in a Changing World

Students will explore the essential economic concepts and theories and how to apply them in today's business world. They will also gain an understanding of various aspects of modern management such as strategy, leadership, marketing, entrepreneurship, sustainability and finance.

2 Philosophy, Politics and Law

On this course students will gain theoretical knowledge and practical expertise of these three core disciplines that underpin the societies in which we live. On completion, participants will have a good understanding of the ideas of some of the great Western thinkers and their application in politics and law.

3 Artificial Intelligence and the World of Python Computer Coding

An introduction to machine and deep learning as the main concepts of artificial intelligence. Students will also become familiar with the coding language Python and learn how to solve individually tailored coding challenges.
